



Child & Adolescent Psychiatry Fontana Medical Center

The Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Fellowship at the new state-of-the-art Fontana Medical Center, is located in what is known as the Inland Empire of Southern California. The 400-bed medical center is the tertiary referral hospital for 542,000 Kaiser Permanente members in the vicinity. Kaiser Permanente Southern California has a membership of over 4 million, and a national membership of over 10 million. Our patient population reflects the Southern California demographic and ethnic diversity—39 percent Caucasian, 29 percent Latino, 15 percent African-American, and 14 percent Asian.

In addition to the Fontana Medical Center, fellows will also spend time at the 224-bed satellite Kaiser Permanente Ontario Medical Center, 89-bed Loma Linda Behavioral Center, and 106-bed Canyon Ridge Hospital. Fellows will also spend time in various outpatient clinics allowing the opportunity for experience in different modalities of therapy and medication management services.


The Fellowship program values education and therefore fellows are not responsible for any clinical duties during lectures and also provides a light call schedule to allow fellows opportunity to prepare for lectures and to be well rested.

The program received ACGME accreditation in 2016 and the core faculty are comprised of board certified Child and Adolescent Psychiatrists. The two-year program accepts 3 fellows per class.
